It is organized by the SCELF, the "Institut français", and Film Paris Region with the support of the Film Market of Cannes and the Cannes Film Festival, the Frankfurt Book Fair, Pro Helvetia, the "Centre Français de la Copie", and the Sofia.

Covid prevented audiovisual professionals from freely circulating in 2020 and 2021, thus limiting in-person meetings. This ninth edition of our event promises to be an exceptional one.

- 10 pitches will be presented by an internationa panel of publishers on Thursday, May 19.
- 43 publishers worldwide will welcome producers looking for strong intellectual properties on Friday, May 20

The present guide is twofold:

- The first part is dedicated to the pitching session,
 where you will find the 47 applications, with a spotlight
 on the 10 works selected by our outstanding international jury.
- The second part, which features more than 80 literary works aims to facilitate discussions with the owners of adaptation rights: 43 publishers and agents worldwide.

In a global context where the demand for rich content is skyrocketing and producers are always on the lookout for the right story, Shoot the Book! plays a more central role than ever in fostering the adaptation business.

As the German occupation advances, and several escape plans fail, the refugees in Villa Emma begin to doubt that they will make it to safety. It is at this point that the citizens of Nonantola join forces in a race against time, tailoring 40 identical coats in just 48 hours. The children manage to flee through Switzerland as though they were on an ordinary school trip, and from there to Palestine.

They all survived.



THE MEN WITH THE PINK TRIANGLE

How to survive in a system intent on your elimination? The true story of a gay man whose will to live was stronger than the persecution he faced as a prisoner in Nazi concentration camps.

1939: a young man aged 22 (we will call him X) was enjoying student life and his first big love with another boy when he was arrested by the Gestapo at his home in Vienna, Austria. His homosexual relationship had been discovered and for this reason he was sent to prison for 6 months.

But instead of being liberated afterward as he thought, X was transported to concentration camps in Germany, first to Sachsenhausen-Orianenburg in January 1940 and then to Flossenbürg in May 1940, where he managed to stay alive throughout the war, unlike many other gay men.

The fate of gay people during WWII continues to be largely unknown and underrepresented in films. This rare testimony has already been praised among gay communities in many countries. A film would open the eyes of a larger audience and encourage respect as persecution continues.

There he had to wear a pink triangle like all of the other homosexual prisoners, whom the Nazi regime was set on eliminating, along with Jews and Gypsies. They were assigned the hardest jobs and abused by their superiors, the Capos (chosen among the criminal or political prisoners) for being as cruel as the SS leaders.

X was a handsome and clever young man who, after agreeing to a first relationship with a Capo that gave him access to a safer job and some extra food, used his charm as a strategy to survive in the camps. From one sexual friendship with a superior to the next, he gained access to better positions and more respect from other prisoners and the SS leaders, eventually becoming one of the first and only gay Capos.

This unique journey gave him a good overview of the organization of the camps, their hierarchy, the daily routine, the mistreatments of the prisoners, but also the leaders' secrets and the power games taking place. Thanks to the honest testimony of this survivor, we are given access to many details and anecdotes which would otherwise have been lost.





FELICE'S POOL

Felice, a 90-year-old man from a mountain village, climbs a steep path every morning to bathe in an icy rock pool. Community life is galvanized when Felice receives a mysterious letter.

The Narrator, who has escaped the chaos of the city, asks Felice if he can shadow his daily life to find out if the rumors going around the village – that Felice, every morning when it is still dark, summer or winter, in rain, wind or snow, climbs an hour through the Selvaccia pine forest to bathe naked in an icy rock pool – are true.

The story takes place in Leontica, a village with 50 inhabitants at an altitude of 1,000 meters. In this corner of the world that is frozen in time, people are humble, hardworking, and unregulated, except by the rhythm of the seasons. Their social life gravitates towards the square with its café, grocery store, town hall, church, and cemetery.

Our lives are hectic: we are slaves to consumerism and constantly chasing success. This book shows us that we can be happy with very little: hardly any possessions, not much money, no technology, and a few true friends.

It is the end of November. For 8 days, Felice and the Narrator start their day at 5 a.m. with a long breakfast, then set off for the rock pool. After bathing there, they dry themselves in the air while waiting for the sun to rise.

The quiet life of Leontica is shaken when Felice receives a letter from the village gossip, the post-mistress. It is not clear where the letter is from, perhaps China or Russia, she tells everyone at the café when Felice and the Narrator are not there.

On the eighth day, the Narrator finds Felice dead in bed. The entire community is reeling with shock. They make their way to the wake, where Pep reveals that Felice had asked him to notify the Institute of Anatomy at Zurich University in the event of his death because he did not want to be buried; he wanted to leave his body to science. In the afternoon, a van arrives from Zurich and Felice's body is taken away.

Days later we discover who wrote the mysterious letter. It was Olmo, Felice's brother who had emigrated in the 1960s to seek his fortune and was returning to Leontica to live out the rest of his days.







The strength of this book lies in the poignant and sweet portrait of an ordinary man who became extraordinary through his horrific death. With his customary verve and humor, the writer makes Emmett likable and familiar to us, while affirming through the voice of Ma Robinson, the former prison guard turned pastor, his faith in a better humanity.

He tells her that they are not just orphans: here, all the boarders are the children of political adversaries who were eliminated by the Phalange, the fascist party that came to power 15 years earlier. Helen and Milos discover that the police have already started a manhunt to track down the fugitives. Despite the danger, they also run away and follow their friends' tracks towards the mountains, in order to help them.

This gripping story recounts
the fight of a generation to defend
the values it inherited from
a "world before." We are close to these
characters, even though they are
from an imaginary land and a fictional
time – highly conductive to
the joys of adaptation.

Helen and Milos manage to neutralize the trackers and their terrible pack of "dog-men." But Milos is injured, captured by the Phalange, and sent to a gladiators' camp: at the next "winter fight," he will be forced to descend into the arena and either kill or be killed, much to the delight of the crowd.

As for Helen, she reaches the capital city, where she is taken in by Mr. Jahn, who offers her a place to stay and a job in his restaurant. There she finds Milena and Bartolomeo, who have joined the resistance. Milena has inherited her mother's talent: she was a popular singer and the symbol of the rebellion. As for Bartolomeo, he soon earns the trust of his dead father's former companions: they recognize the thirst for freedom and the strength of conviction that raised them up 15 years ago.

Will the resistance, bloodily crushed during their parents' time, change the course of History? Will Helen and Milos ever be allowed to be together again? The fight of these four characters, a spectacular hymn to courage and freedom, could be said to be a losing battle. And yet...
